

Read: Matthew 5:27-30

How does this passage broaden the concept of sin beyond just the commandment of "thou shalt not lust?"

What does this verse tell us about the importance of what goes on in our minds?

What actions does Jesus list when speaking of how to deal with the underlying sin of lust? Why do you think he used such extreme statements? What was he trying to convey?

What we take in with our eyes and let ruminate in our minds eventually comes out in how we act, what we do, and what we grab at in an attempt to possess it. This is why Jesus specifically speaks to the eye and the hand. 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Read: Romans 6:12-14; 2 Corinthians 10:5

How might we combat the lust that lives in our hearts and minds?

What practical steps can you employ to reduce your exposure to things that might cause you to lust, with regard to what you take in with your eyes and put your hands to work to gain?

What can we learn about God from these passages?

Is there anything you feel the Holy Spirit nudging you to look at more closely?
